

Our Service

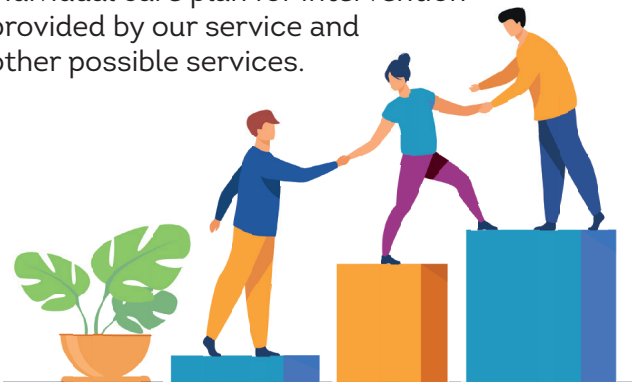
The Community Addictions Team has a number of specialist practitioners to help people experiencing dependency or harmful use of substances.

What to expect

When your referral is accepted you will receive a letter advising that you are on an appointment waiting list. When we are able to offer you a first appointment we will write again to ask you to contact us to agree a suitable date and time. For urgent appointments we will attempt to contact you by phone and text message in the first instance. If unsuccessful we will write to ask you to contact us to agree a suitable date and time. **It is important that you respond to our contacts**, otherwise you will be removed from the waiting list.

Your care pathway begins with an assessment appointment, lasting up to 90 minutes. Please allow 45 minutes for follow up review appointments. Together we will discuss the problems from your alcohol/substance use, and your alcohol/substance use history. You will also be asked about the impact your addiction challenges have had on your family.

Together we will explore and identify your individual care plan for intervention provided by our service and other possible services.
