FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 – INFORMATION REQUEST

A. How many patients have been treated with the following drugs in the past 4 months:

- **Atogepant (Aquipta) – any disease**
- **Erenumab (Aimovig) - any disease**
- **Eptinezumab (Vypti) – any disease**
- **Fremanezumab (Ajovy) - any disease**
- **Galcanezumab (Emgality) - any disease**
- **Rimegepant (Vydura) – any disease**
- **Botulinum Toxin (i.e., Botox, Dysport, Xeomin) - migraine ONLY**

Response:

This information is not centrally held. In order to provide this information a significant manual trawl of patient records is required. The cost of locating and retrieving the information exceeds the “appropriate limit” as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004. In order to obtain this information, it would exceed the £450 limit and is therefore cost prohibitive.

In addition, it would not be appropriate to search through individual patient records for the purposes for responding to a FOI request, there would be no patient expectation that medical records would be used in this way.

Under section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, Public Authorities are not obliged to comply with an information request where to do so would exceed the cost limit.

Furthermore, under Section 16 of the Freedom of Information Act, we can advise that it would require an extensive manual review of individual patient records just to ascertain if information relevant to your request is held. As such, we advise that there is no way to refine this request to bring it within the appropriate limit.

- **Rimegepant (Vydura)**
