NEW UNIT TO IMPROVE EMERGENCY CARE NOW OPEN

The new Direct Assessment Unit at Daisy Hill is now open.

Located in the former General Outpatients Department, the Direct Assessment Unit was one of the proposals agreed through Pathfinder to help sustain and develop unscheduled care services for Newry and Mourne.

Services in the new Unit will begin in a phased way, initially with the Day Clinical Centre, Older People's

Assessment Unit and Clinical Decision Unit which have moved from other parts of the building. It is planned that by March, the Ambulatory team will also be taking referrals for suitable patients directly from GPs and the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service READ MORE Click here to see what the unit looks like inside and to meet some of its staff.

Hospital at Home for Older People in Newry and Mourne

Our Acute Care at Home service is now available to older people in the Newry and Mourne area. As the first Consultant Geriatrician Led service of its kind in Northern Ireland, the team aims to respond to referrals from GPs. Northern Ireland Ambulance service and local hospitals within just a few hours.

The service has been expanding across the area since it was originally set up as a pilot in 2014, preventing around 4050 hospital admissions and supporting earlier discharge for over 1400 people. READ MORE





New Pay and Display Parking at Daisy Hill

A new Pay and Display Car Park is now open at the main entrance at Daisy Hill Hospital to help patients accessing the new Outpatients Department at Bernish House.

Car Park C is directly opposite the main entrance, situated between the Mental Health Building and Clanrye House.

Parking enforcement will apply to cars parked in Car Park C without a valid ticket. The Pay and Display machine is located at Car Park C and charges are:
