Role of NIAS

- NIAS is the lead partner organisation
- It is an Alerting organisation (sends app push notification to App Responders)



What it means for SHSCT

- Appropriately trained Staff – Basic Life Support, Intermediate Life Support and Advanced Life Support
- Verification of staff through existing training – no additional cost (Ongoing In-House training)
- App free to download
- Indemnity – Regional Indemnity Business case with Department of Health (ongoing discussions with NIAS and Dr Michael McBride CMO)
- Potential cost for administrator for Verification process in Resuscitation Team – subject to staff uptake

Role of SHSCT

- We will be a Verifying organisation
 - i. Trust email
 - ii. Staff Number
 - iii. Identification
 - iv. Proof of Certification (Basic Life Support and above)

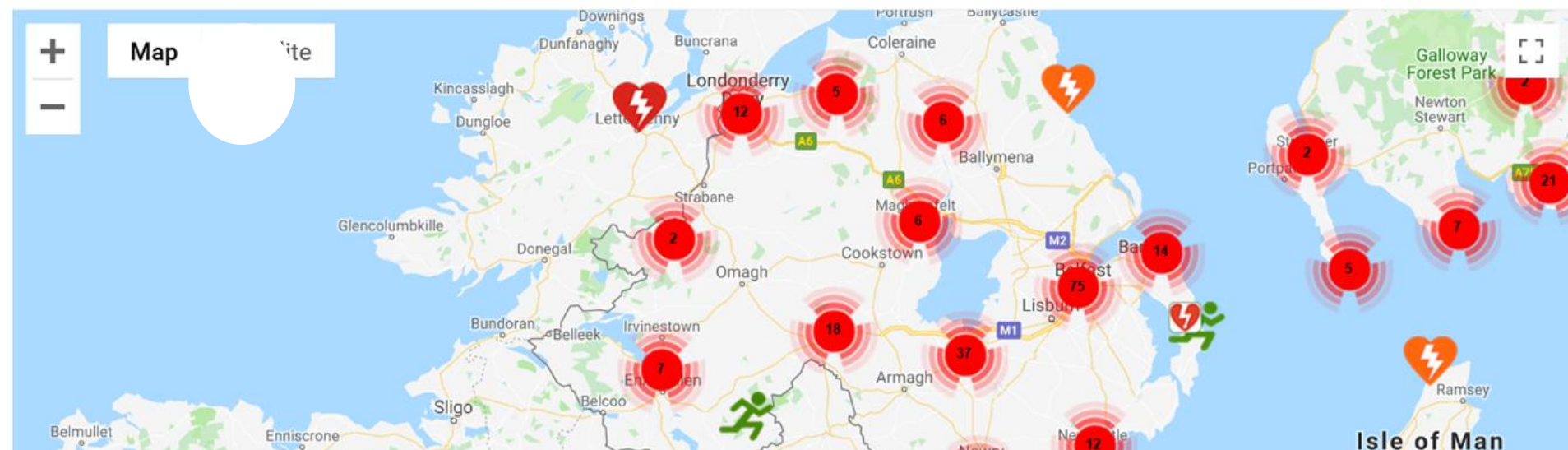

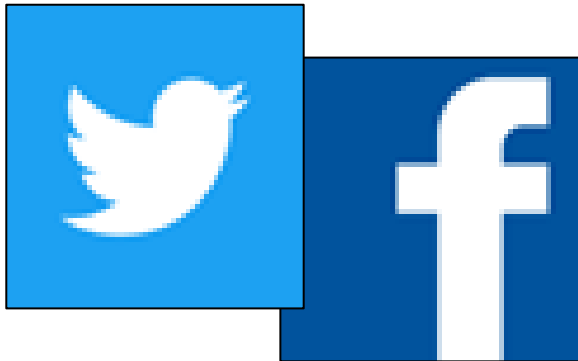

Championing GoodSAM in SHSCT

- Communication Plan
