


Transition Pathway




You have a new case manager in the Adult Disability Transition Team



Transition happens when you move from children's to adult services



We are making a plan to help you move on from school



These are the steps that will happen during your transition from children's to adult services



Your children's case manager will talk with your new case manager on the Transition Team



You will get a letter that tells you who your new case manager is and tells you about the Transition Team



Your children's case manager and your new case manager from the Transition Team will visit you at home



Your new case manager will get to know all about you



Your new case manager will complete an assessment. This is called a NISAT



The NISAT helps your new case manager learn what help you need.



A plan will be made to get you the help you need when you move to adult services



Your carer can have their own assessment to help them get the support they need.

This is called the carer's conversation wheel.



Your case manager will make referrals to staff in the Transition Team- such as Speech and Language Therapists, Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists.



The team will help prepare you to move to adult services and get you the support you need for leaving school



Your children's social worker is your key worker until you turn 18.



If you have any questions about transition you can ring your new case manager on the Transition Team



In your last year of school there will be meetings to plan your move from school to adult services.



Your family, your teachers and staff from the Transition Team will go to these meetings



There will be at least 3 meetings throughout the year.



Your school will tell you the dates and times of these meetings



These meetings will help you decide what you want to do when you leave school



Your Transition case manager can help you understand your options for when you leave school



You will leave school in June



The Transition Team will help you move to adult services
