



Speech and Language Therapy Games to motivate children when practicing speech sounds

Games involving parts:

- Each player should take their turn to say their sound or word then be rewarded with a go on the game
- Suitable games include: Marble Run, Tumbling Monkeys, Pop-up Pirate, Kerrplunk, Jigsaws, Jenga etc.

Board Games:

- Each player should take their turn to say their sound or word then be rewarded with a go on the game
- Suitable games include: Ludo, Frustration, Snakes and Ladders, Dominoes etc.

Other Games

- Noughts and Crosses
 - Make a large board (3X3) and place a picture card in each square
 - Each player should take their turn to say their sound or word then be rewarded by adding a nought or cross in the square they want to
- Treasure Hunt
 - Hide the cards around the room
 - Each player should take turns to find the cards around the room and say the sound or word they
- Stepping Stones
 - Place the pictures face up on the floor to make a path
 - Each player should take their turn to say their sound or word as they stand on a stepping stone to cross the path
- Mystery Bag
 - Hide the pictures in a 'mystery bag'
 - Each player should take their turn to say their sound or word each time they take a picture out of the 'mystery bag'
- Towers
 - Use some bricks to take turns to make a tower
 - Each player should take their turn to say their sound or word each time they add a brick
- Pairs (you will need 2x pictures for this game)
 - Shuffle the cards, lay them out face down on the table, and take it in turns to pick up two cards and say their sound or word
 - If the pictures are the same, the player keeps them and has another go.
 - If they are different the player puts them back and the other player takes their turn.
