FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 – INFORMATION REQUEST

1. Can you please advise how many Real time Continuous Glucose monitors are funded by the trust for Paediatrics at present	169
2. Can you please break this figure down into the individual CGMs being funded by the Trust (i.e. Dexcom, Medtronic Guardian 4)	142 x Dexcom 9 x Medtronic Guardian GL3 10 x Medtronic Guardian GL4
3. Can you please advise how many Real time Continuous Glucose monitors are funded by the trust for Adults and give a breakdown of which CGM it is that is being funded (i.e. Dexcom or Medtronic Guardian 4)	31 xDexcom 12 x Medtronic Guardian GL3 <5 x Medtronic Guardian GL4.
4. Can you please advise are there any plans to fund more Dexcom G6 or G7 or Medtronic Guardian 4 in the future and if so when is this likely to take place both for children and adults and a breakdown for each CGM G6/7 and Guardian 4.	Children and adults are offered CGM as per NICE guidelines and are funded by the Trust.
5. How many CGMs were funded for children in the last year	28 (Estimate based on those newly diagnosed between August 2021 – Dec 2022 and on CGM).
6. How many children attend the Trust with Type one diabetes	328

The Trust has a legal duty to protect patient confidentiality and, in line with this duty, the figure <5 has been provided where figures are very low. This is because of the potential risk of identification of an individual. In reaching this decision the Trust has taken into account the small geographical area which the Trust serves and the sensitivity of the information requested. In addition the Trust has taken into account the fact that all

information disclosed in response to an FOI is disclosed to the 'world at large' and is published on the Trust website.

S 40 (2) (third party information) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 has been applied to exempt the redacted information from disclosure. The Trust does not consider the disclosure of the redacted information to be fair to the individuals concerned as there is the potential risk of identification of an individual(s) which they would not expect, and which would therefore breach the fairness element of the first principle of the Data Protection Act 2018.

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
