Non-renewal of annual contract.


(1.3) What is it trying to achieve (intended aims/outcomes)?

The Trust has reviewed its position and identified that the contract with Futureproof INC Ltd if renewed would be a duplication of services commissioned by PHA in Southern Trust area.
