Confirm the scope of services provided to adults (people 18 or older) seeking care for ADHD	There is no adult ADHD diagnostic service in the Southern Trust and our intervention service is limited to service users with a confirmed diagnosis (received in CAMHS services or previously via adult mental health services) requiring ongoing medication management. If a service user was previously diagnosed and was discharged following disengagement, but sought to restart medications, the decision to accept the referral would be made on a case by case basis. For example, if recently disengaged, the service could consider accepting a referral but if off medications and out of service for long period of years they would likely need re-assessed and therefore would not be accepted. Private assessments are not accepted by services.
