any status under the Mental Health Act (informal or detained)

People not included:

patients in accommodation not registered as hospital beds

patients in beds for physical health care

patients who do not have either learning disabilities or autism

Please note this should not just include people with Learning disability in a 'Mental Health' bed - if a person is in specialist hospital bed either Mental Health or Learning Disability and that person has a Learning Disability or Autism, then that person should be included.
